

FESTIVAL GALA OPENING CONCERT



TOM HEALEY directs the Vox Angelica Geelong Chamber Choir. He has been making music in Geelong since 1981 and is a past Director of Music at Geelong Grammar, former conductor of GAMA Singers (now the Geelong Chorale), conductor of many Geelong Summer Music Camp choirs, former Director of Music at

St Andrew's Church Brighton with its large choir of Choral Scholars, and former Acting Director of the Choir of Trinity College, Melbourne University. He is also active as an organist and baritone soloist and has sung and recorded with The Ensemble of the Fourteenth Century, Les Six and La Romanesca. He is on the board of the Australian Youth Classical Music Competition and President of Music at the Basilica.



MALCOLM JOHN attended The Geelong College, and Melbourne University, and studied Choral Conducting at Juilliard School (NY), gaining his Doctorate from York University in 1969. In his teaching role at schools & colleges and for amateur orchestras and choirs, Malcolm has composed

much. Malcolm has written over 40 Choral Homilies for St. Luke's UCA Highton. His new Palm Sunday cantata was sung there this year. His newly commissioned GCMS Anniversary Piano Trio was performed by the brilliant 'Firebird Trio' on 23rd February this year. Malcolm is delighted to be commissioned once again by Music at the Basilica Inc, this time for 14 Stations of the Cross for Holy Week.



LEE ABRAHMSEN, possessing a voice "with a deliciously full-bodied tone, rich in expression and control", is a multi-award winning artist both on the operatic stage and concert platform. Hailing from Geelong and graduating from the University of Melbourne with honours degrees

in Music and Education, Lee pursued studies in Europe with Antonio Moretti-Pananti (Florence), Daniel Ferro Vocal Program and Festival (Tuscany), Bel Canto Festival (Holland) and in Australia at the Lisa Gasteen National Opera School. Her many Australian Awards include the 86th Herald Sun Aria, Opera Awards Royal Over-Seas League Prize, Opera Awards 4MBS Performance Prize, Acclaim Awards Italian Fellowship Award and the Melbourne Welsh Choir Singer of the Year Competition. Lee has been heard regularly on ABC Classic FM and has sung principal roles with all major Opera Companies in Victoria including Tannhäuser, Madama Butterfly, Carmen, and many others. She has performed internationally in Japan, at St Martin in the Fields (London), the Edinburgh Festival and has toured China. In 2017, she made her debut with

Opera Australia in Le Nozze di Figaro, and performed Tosca with Australian Discovery Orchestra. Lee recently received rave reviews for her performance as Isolde in Melbourne Opera's production of *Tristan and Isolde*.



SALLY WILSON has been performing in the UK, USA, Europe, Asia and Australia for twenty years in recital, concert, chamber music and opera, in roles including Komponist (Ariadne auf Naxos), Ottavia (Poppea), Ottone (La Griselda, Vivaldi), Dorabella (Così fan tutte), Hänsel (Hänsel äund Gretel).

Hänsel (Hänsel äund Gretel), Rosina (II barbiere di Siviglia), Waltraute (Die Walküre), Jenny (Mahagonny), Agathe (Der Freischütz) among others. Though beginning her career as a mezzo soprano, Ms Wilson transitioned into the soprano fach over the last several years. Her repertoire encompasses major roles from Handel and Mozart, now to Strauss and Verdi. Ms Wilson is very active in concert and recital. Career highlights include performances with the Chicago Symphony Chamber Players at the Ravinia Festival, concerts at the Konzerthaus Berlin, concerts at the Aldeburgh Festival as well as Wigmore Hall, Bernstein's "Jeremiah" with the Polish National Radio Symphony in Katowice, a concert for royalty in Aarhus. In addition to her performing commitments, Sally Wilson teaches privately and at Monash University, and has given master classes in Australia, Asia, the USA and Europe, and at Geelong Grammar School, Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts, Pennsylvania State University and at the Kuala Lumpur Performing Arts Centre.



STEPHEN MOSCHNER studied Oboe at the Sydney Conservatorium of music and Victorian College of the Arts. He is a busy administrator as well as performer and has worked with orchestras in Australia and overseas, and on events ranging from the Opening Ceremony of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games to

Sydney 2000 Olympic Games to Local education events. Stephen teaches Reed Making at Melbourne Conservatorium and for over 15 years has run **Oboe Central** - Australia's major supplier of Oboe reeds, machines, accessories and technical advice to Oboe professionals and students. He is a founding member and Secretary of the Australasian Double Reed Society and has been published in the International Double Reed Society Journal and presented at the 2014 International Conference at New York University on his work on teaching Circular Breathing. Stephen plays oboes made by the Patricola family in Italy. At Music at the Basilica he has performed various concertos by Bach and has played in the Ensemble on may occasions.

Starting the program is the largest and arguably, the finest of JS Bach's motets - Jesu, meine Freude BWV 227; an eleven-movement palindromic structure bound together by the exploration of a single chorale melody. Australian composer Clare Maclean's Christ the King is a superb work written in 1984 for the Sydney Chamber Choir, which makes prominent use of plainsong and Renaissance-inspired techniques. The mood of elevation in this piece carries into the Missa Papae Marcelli

In the late sixteenth century a legend grew up around Palestrina's Missa *Papae Marcelli*. The Council of Trent had expressed concerns that polyphony obscured sacred texts, thus interfering with the listener's devotion.

But the simple, declamatory style of much of the Missa *Papae Marcelli* convinced the church authorities that polyphony could be intelligible as well as beautiful. In fact, nineteenth-century musicologists dubbed Palestrina the 'saviour of polyphony'. Hyperbole aside, there is no doubt that the Missa *Papae Marcelli* is one of Palestrina's greatest achievements – a work marked by its lucidity, concision and sheer splendour of sound.

GLORIANA is one of Melbourne's finest chamber choirs and their repertoire includes both early and contemporary music, sacred and secular. Gloriana was formed in 1994, initially as a sixteen-piece ensemble. Now their membership consists of over thirty voices. They have developed a progressive focus on contemporary classic music by both Australian and international composers. Gloriana has also presented the Melbourne and Australian premieres of many contemporary works.

Most often an a cappella choir, but increasingly Gloriana's concerts feature instrumental ensembles and chamber orchestras. They are proud to work with some of the best players in Australia and have regularly performed in festivals such as the Organs of the Ballarat Goldfields and the Hamilton Promenade of Sacred Music. ANDREW RAISKUMS is a

musician based in Melbourne, Australia. Andrew established Gloriana Chamber Choir in 1994. The choir soon expanded its numbers along with its repertoire. Gloriana's repertoire now includes Bach's motets and the B minor Mass, the requiems of Brahms,

Fauré and Duruflé, all of the a cappella works of Francis Poulenc. Tallis' Spem in Alium. Handel's Messiah, most of Britten's works for a cappella choir and Rachmaninoff's All-Night Vigil. Gloriana has given numerous Australian premieres of works by contemporary composers both from Australia and abroad. Andrew has also worked with a number of other choirs ranging from school groups to the Royal Melbourne Philharmonic Society and the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra Chorus. Currently Andrew is also Director of Music at St Peter's Eastern Hill in Melbourne, and has played an important role in nourishing the musical traditions of one of metropolitan Melbourne's finest church choirs.

STRINGENDO - WENDY AND FRIENDS FAVOURITE WORKS FOR STRING ORCHESTRA

Stringendo was a string ensemble, flexible in size, that was available over many years for concerts and special occasions. Based in Geelong and organised by Wendy Galloway, the group could be as small as a string trio or as large as a small chamber orchestra. This concert features some of our favourites from those years. It begins with the elegance of the classical period with Mozart's delightful Divertimento and Haydn's exuberant violin concerto in C Major, performed by young ANAM virtuoso Liam Oborne. We then move to 20th Century romanticism expressed in Samuel Barber's moving Adagio and Peter Warlock's depiction of ancient dances. The program concludes with Elgar's masterly Serenade.



LIAM OBORNE began playing the violin after an unfortunate misunderstanding in which he confused the names of the violin and cello. Although he initially wanted to study the cello, he has had a passion for performing the violin as a soloist, chamber and orchestral musician ever since he started playing at the

age of five.

Liam has performed as a soloist with the Geelong

Philharmonic Orchestra and the University of Tasmania Orchestra in addition to being a member of numerous ensembles including the Melbourne Youth Orchestra, the University of Melbourne Orchestra, the Monash Academy Orchestra, the Tasmanian Discovery Orchestra and the University of Tasmania Orchestra. Since 2011, he has played regularly with the Australian Youth Orchestra and has been a guest musician with the ANAM Orchestra in the past. Liam has worked professionally as a casual musician with the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra since 2016 and is a founding member of the Shore String Quartet.

Liam began studying a Bachelor of Music at the University of Tasmania in 2013 and graduated with first class Honours in 2016. While completing his degree, he studied violin with Jun Yi Ma and Christopher Kimber, and was the recipient of several scholarships including the D&MV McDonald Scholarship in String Instruments and the UTAS/TSO Orchestral Scholarship. He has also received several awards including the regional section of the Australian Youth Classical Music Competition, which he won in 2009.

In 2018 Liam is looking forward to completing his second year at the Australian National Academy of Music (ANAM) where he is currently studying with Robin Wilson.

PLANTS OF THE BIBLE EXHIBITION AT THE BASILICA

4 to 13 May 2018



The exhibition of *Plants of the Bible* brings together a collection of foliage, flowers, fruits and seeds from many of the plants named in either the New or the Old Testament of the Bible. These plants have an important place in many Bible stories. Sometimes they are used to teach through imagery; at other times they are symbols of God's goodness and bounty. The grapes and wheat are central to the story of the Eucharist. The natural cycle of plant life is often linked to human life and experience in a way that has deep meaning for those who are close to the land and its abundance.

In this exhibition, brought together by Ron Eichler, each plant displayed is linked to a text from the Bible. A short piece from the text is displayed on a card, with its source - chapter and verse. The plants have been gathered from many gardens and other sources. Some have been specially grown for this display and others have been represented with cuttings, dried plants, seeds and branches. There are hundreds of other plants and verses which would have made a wonderful display, but we have selected those that are in season or available locally. Whatever the source, the Biblical reference is still relevant. The exhibition gives us an insight into the wonder of the natural world and its link with our lives.

Visit the exhibition whenever the Basilica is open during the week of the Music Festival. Wander through the ambulatory, which is itself an architectural rarity in Victoria, with its five small chapels, and take your time over the display. We hope you enjoy this exhibition.

DIVERSITY

Jeremy Thurlow – Luce si Vivace (1996/2009), flute and organ: Composer, Jeremy Thurlow is Lecturer in Music and Director of Studies at Robinson College and an Affiliated Lecturer in the Faculty of Music, the University of Cambridge, UK. His music has been described as 'seductive, innovative, full of freshness' by Henri Dutilleux, and these characteristics are evident in the pieces performed in this concert.

Luce se Vivace (light and lively) is a work in which the two instruments are given an independence of rhythm that appears quite free in the score, but cleverly aligns in an expressive, characteristic piece.

Lob sei Gott – solo organ: Commissioned as part of the Orgelbuchlein Project in 2010, the chorale Lob sei Gott for organ is spikey and rhythmic with added note harmony: the chorale melody is in the pedals.

Valerie Ross – Synergies III: Rasa of Time for flute and organ (2013): Written for Jean Penny and Andrew Blackburn by Malaysian composer, Valerie Ross, this work explores cultural interconnections through the

juxtaposition of two significant elements Malaysian and Western cultures - Hindustani raga and Gregorian chant. The score is circular, representing the face of a clock, recalling and representing both the plainchant music of the hours of the Christian church and the Carnatic music from which musical content and artistic aims of the piece originate. The work was premiered by Andrew Jean and at Churchill College. the University of Cambridge in 2013.

ANDREW BLACKBURN's career has spanned a broad range of musical pursuits, including music education, keyboard performance, music technology, and choral conducting. He has performed widely as soloist and with orchestras and ensembles in many parts of the world, including Australia, Malaysia, Sweden, Denmark, Germany, Hungary, the UK and Italy. Dr Blackburn was, until recently, a Research Fellow at Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris, Malaysia, having been appointed in 2011 as Senior Lecturer in Music, and Deputy Director of UPSI Education Research Laboratory, and he has now been appointed as a Research Fellow at the Faculty of Arts and Education, Federation University in Ballarat. His involvement in research projects includes higher education training and assessment, intercultural music, and leading research on organ performance - particularly pipe organ and live electronic processing of sound (DSP), new forms of musical representation, and musical histories in Malaysia. Andrew completed his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in 2011, for which his thesis was The Pipe Organ and Realtime Digital Signal Processing: A Performer's Perspective.

JEAN PENNY, Australian flautist/researcher/educator/editor, returned to Australia in 2016 following four years as Senior Lecturer in Music at the Fakulti Muzik dan Seni Persembahan, Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris, Malaysia and her subsequent appointment as a Fellow at the UPSI Education Research Laboratory. She has extensive experience in performance with major Australian symphony orchestras, chamber ensembles and solo recitals both in Australia and abroad.

Dr Penny's work is grounded in Western art music cultures – principally new music performance, intercultural studies and practice-led research. Her Doctor of Musical Arts (QCGU 2009) study investigated the performative nexus of flute with digital technologies. In Malaysia she led major research projects, taught at undergraduate, graduate and post-graduate levels, and was Chief Editor of the peer reviewed Malaysian Music Journal from 2012-2015. She has presented at many national and international conferences and forums, and has won numerous awards, research and arts grants, sponsorships and university awards. This year Jean has

been appointed as a Research Fellow in the Faculty of Arts and Education at Federation University, Ballarat, where she looks forward to developing new community, academic and musical activities.

JULIE SEAL was very involved in music at school and in the community, as a student and always wanted to be a musician. She completed her B.Mus and Grad.Dip.Ed at Melbourne University and then went on to perform for a number of years as clarinetist in Melbourne and Sydney. She became a full-time music

teacher and taught at Wesley College in Melbourne for many years as a clarinet specialist, a classroom music teacher and a Choral and Band director.

Julie has continued with her clarinet teaching and performing in Geelong and has returned to her love of the recorder, running the 'Accord' recorder consort with 7 dedicated recorder players. She is currently singing with the Melbourne Bach Choir and Chamber Choir.

JOHN SEAL's first interest in music began when he was 10, playing in a Drum and Fife band at school. He started learning drum-kit at that time and then developed complete facility on all percussion instruments, with a particular love of tuned percussion. At the age 18 years the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra employed John as a full-time percussionist, where he worked for many years. He subsequently taught percussion at Melbourne University and at music high schools in Melbourne, while also playing in professional theatre productions. John is now teaching part-time in Geelong and performing in the Australian Pops Orchestra He is continuing to explore his fascination with tuned percussion instruments as a soloist, a chamber musician and as a bass player.

PASSIONS OF THE SEICENTO

This program explores the music of the Italian seicento for soprano and archlute. Featuring works from well-known composers of the seventeenth century such as Monteverdi, Strozzi and Frescobaldi, as well as less familiar names such as Mazzocchi, Merula and Kapsberger, the selection highlights the frequent equivocations between the sacred and the secular in the reflection of human passions and devotion.



ROBERTA DIAMOND specialises in the interpretation of renaissance and baroque music and performs in a variety of ensembles across Europe and Australia dedicated to this repertoire. Roberta has a particular interest in Italian music of the 17th century. In 2016 Roberta completed a Master's Degree in Performance at the Guildhall School

of Music and Drama, London with Marie Vassiliou, supported by The Guildhall School Trust. Currently studying with Andrew Dalton, Roberta recently performed the role of Amore in Monteverdi's Incoronazione di Poppea with Pinchgut Opera.

Roberta is a member of Emma Kirkby's ensemble for lutes and voices, Dowland Works, with whom she regularly performs. Upcoming projects include performances with Lux Musicae London as part of the York Early Music Festival, a concert series of French baroque music with Ensemble Molière and a tour with Australia's foremost vocal ensemble, The Song Company, under the direction of Antony Pitts. Roberta also enjoys collaborating with folk musicians from all over the world in cross-cultural projects and in 2018 will return to the Ketevan Festival of Sacred Music in Goa, India.



NICHOLAS POLLOCK Nicholas Pollock is a Melbourne-based multi-instrumentalist specialising in early plucked strings. Starting out on electric guitar, he then progressed to the renaissance lute, theorbo, baroque guitar, baroque lute, archlute, cittern and most recently the gallichon. Nicholas commenced his early instrument studies with Andrew Byrne (Sydney) and has

Andrew Byrne (Sydney) and has performed in masterclasses with leading international plucked-string specialists such as Hopkinson Smith, Nigel North, Eduardo Egüez and Xavier Diaz-Lattore. A dynamic and versatile performer, Nicholas is equally at home playing guitar in a punk band as performing the intimate lute works of John Dowland on the concert stage. He has a particular interest in the lute and theorbo music of seventeenth-century France. Nicholas is in demand as a continuo player and regularly performs with leading Australian early music ensembles including Latitude 37, Van Diemen's Band, e21, the Consort of Melbourne, Accademia Arcadia, and the Orchestra of the Antipodes. He has appeared in concert at the Brisbane Baroque Festival, the Peninsula Summer Music Festival, the Woodend Winter Arts Festival and the Organs of the Ballarat Goldfields Festival. He co-directs Ensemble 642 with the baroque harpist Hannah Lane creating dynamic performances of music from the age of basso continuo in collaboration with the finest young Australian early music specialists.


CHORAL DIRECTOR YVONNE GILTINAN
