'RE-CONNECTIONS' YOUTH SERIES - NEW FOR 2022



This new collection of five events from the young artists of Geelong is supported by a grant from City of Greater Geelong's *Covid 19 Arts Recovery Program.* The grants are designed to get the Arts thriving again, and part of our \$10000 grant will allow young people to perform in public and reconnect with each other and with audiences to make the arts live again. The groups of young artists, mentored by their teachers, are combining in short programs that

bring together music, choral singing, movement, performance of exam pieces from VCE students, strings ensemble, poetry and visual art, so it is exciting to be reconnecting different art-forms with music. We are really pleased with this new addition to our normal program, and we hope you will come to these five events. We have made them free so that families and children can attend to enjoy the work of the young performers. One event is at the Geelong Art Gallery. Here the students will present poetry and instrumental music as the patrons wander around the Gallery in the normal way. It will not be a formal, seated event, just something that grows. Four other events will be at the Basilica. There is more information in the brochure. We look forward to showcasing Geelong's young artists in this new series.

13th ANNUAL WINDFIRE FESTIVAL OF MUSIC - OCTOBER 2022

After twelve successes, the Windfire Festival is firmly on the arts scene in Geelong and needs no introduction. In those twelve years, it has known some adventures! A little reminiscence won't hurt! The artists for our very first Opening Concert withdrew in the last week, throwing us into chaos. . Hasty re-arrangement was required to engage new artists and bring in a baby grand piano! Another time, a mini-bus of Melbourne singers became lost for an hour. They zipped past the venue several times. We chased the bus and piloted them to the venue. The singing was worth the wait! One year, weeks of creativity went into constructing hand-made paper lanterns and huge fiery torches for a torchlight parade. Geelong turned on its coldest weather, most violent winds and heaviest rain for 100 years that day. We quickly adapted to an indoor event, but the torches had to stay outside!

Do you remember the horses from Creswick's Australian Light Horse? They were no trouble at all, standing to attention outside the churches, parading along the road, watching over an Anzac service on the lawn at the Basilica, with resplendent riders of course. That was a highlight!

We mustn't forget the floral carpets – thousands of dahlias, fresh-picked at dawn by gum-booted volunteers on a farm at Winchelsea, with a couple of keen-eyed bulls eyeing us suspiciously!



There is no need for me to describe the Festival confusion we had to sort through during the pandemic! Cancellations – postponements – hours of phone calls – non-stop emails – tearing up the calendar – throwing out the useless printed materials! But never giving up!

The result of all this resourcefulness is that, this year, you are being treated to two Festivals. The twice-postponed Festival planned for 2020 finally happened in March 2022 and was a huge success. Covid ensured that 2021 missed out completely, hidden behind tight-fitting masks and a thick fog of hand-sanitiser. The 2022 Festival, described in the brochure, is to happen from 7th to 16th October.

I think we can say that the Festival has been a growing, changing, challenging, adaptable event, but it has always brought our audience the same quality, no matter what our patient, tenacious and determined organizers and artists have had to face up to. Let's hope there is no déjà-vu!


FREE LUNCHTIME ORGAN RECITALS FOR ADVENT
