WINDFIRE CHORAL SCHOLARSHIPS 2024

The Windfire Chamber Choir was founded as part of the Music at the Basilica Inc concert programme. The choir is a mixed ensemble of 30 to 40 singers, which aims to give polished performances of fine music, presenting two concerts a year, often with orchestral accompaniment, in the grand space of St Mary's Basilica, Geelong, and is conducted by Joseph Hie, an experienced and highly regarded musician.

Up to eight choral scholarships a year are offered (four for sopranos or altos, and four for tenors or basses). We aim to give successful scholarship applicants the opportunity to sing exciting music with a fine choir, conducted by one of Australia's most exciting young choral conductors. Applications are now invited

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be:

- aged 15 to 27;
- currently studying, or intending to study, at an approved secondary or tertiary education institution, either full or part time, in 2023/24;
- Australian citizens

VALUE OF SCHOLARSHIP

Windfire Choral Scholars will receive \$500 per year to use as they choose to further their studies in an approved secondary or tertiary course. The scholarships are paid in two instalments: \$200 after the first concert of the year and \$300 after the second concert.

SCHOLARSHIP CONDITIONS

We aim to give our Windfire Scholars a great musical experience in which they develop their choral and musical skills and enjoy being part of a fine choir, giving exciting performances. Our Windfire Scholars give back to the choir and the community by being part of a core group of enthusiastic young singers who provide leadership by dedicating themselves to developing vocally and musically and learning the music thoroughly.

Windfire Choral Scholars:

- sing with the Windfire Chamber Choir for two concerts in 2024;
- attend all regular rehearsals and the 'dress' rehearsal for each concert. Rehearsals are once a week from 7.30
 -9.45pm over a 6 to 8 week period prior to each concert:
- may be required to attend additional special rehearsals;
- are asked to be present five minutes before the scheduled rehearsal or call time;
- are expected to practise music and vocal technique between rehearsals so that they are familiar with the music and in this way can be vocal leaders within the choir:
- will be responsible for their choir music. Loss or damage may need to be paid for at the Artistic Director's discretion:
- need to provide their own all-black performing uniform as directed.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Requests for leave of absence must be received and approved by the Artistic Director at least two weeks in advance. Scholars must obtain the permission of the Artistic Director before accepting other musical engagements or work commitments which conflict with the scholar's commitments to the Windfire Chamber Choir. Extended absences due to illness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

RENEWAL AND CONCLUSION OF SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships are awarded for one year and are renewable by the normal application and audition process. Special consideration may be given to students taking a study break. The Artistic Director may suspend, reduce or end the scholarship if a scholar, after being warned, continues to fail to fulfil commitments.
